DeSoto County banker elected to MBA Board of Directors

JACKSON – William M. Renovich of Nesbit has been elected to a 3-year term on the Mississippi Bankers Association Board of Directors.

Renovich will represent his area of the state on the Board, which governs the 120-year-old association.

MBA's membership includes 103 commercial banks and savings institutions, representing 99 percent of the bank deposits in Mississippi.

Renovich is the president and CEO of Horn Lake-based DeSoto County Bank. He is the organizing CEO and has worked there for four years. The bank opened its doors in January 2006.

Before his employment with DeSoto County Bank, Renovich served for six years as president and CEO of First National Bank of the Pine Belt in Laurel. After FNB's merger with The First, A National Banking

Association, he served as Laurel branch president for The First for one year. Prior to that, he was president of Deposit Guaranty National Bank in Laurel and a lender at the Bank of Laurel.

Active in the Association, Renovich has been a member of the MBA Legislative Committee and served as a Mississippi Young Bankers Councilman-at-Large for two years.



Renovich earned both a bachelor's and a master's degree from the University of Mississippi. He has furthered his banking education by completing the Mississippi School of Banking, the National Commercial Lending Graduate School and the Graduate School of Banking at Louisiana State University.

Renovich is very involved in the local community. He is a member of the DeSoto Economic Council Board of Directors, a member of the Home Builders Association of North Mississippi Board of Directors, a past chairman of DeSoto County United Way, and a past president of the national Ole Miss Alumni Association. He has also served on the boards of the Ole Miss Athletic Committee and the University of Mississippi Foundation.
